Sussex County Technical School will continue to follow the New Jersey State and New Jersey Department of Health guidance for physical distancing. As of June 2, 2021, a minimum of three 3 feet of physical distancing between students should be maintained in classrooms with additional safety precautions in place. Classroom areas are arranged so that three 3 feet of physical distancing between students and staff members can be maintained. Funds will be used in accordance with all state and local health provisions and to provide the most effective learning experiences possible under the following conditions.
